FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED REGULATION:

UCF-2.0011 Readmission as Undergraduate Student.

- (1) A student must apply for readmission to the Registrar's Office when:
 - (a) the student has not enrolled at UCF for two consecutive semesters (not including the Summer term);
 - (b) the student has been academically suspended from UCF;

(c) the student failed to enroll or withdrew from all classes during the readmitted term; or

(d) the student has previously attended, or is currently enrolled at UCF, as "degree seeking" and desires to pursue a second bachelor's degree.

(2) Even where a student is eligible to apply for readmission, readmission is within the discretion of the University and is not automatic. A student who has been denied readmission has thirty (30) days from the date of the denial to appeal that denial to the Admission and Standards Committee. Students should consult the Undergraduate Catalog for details concerning the appeal process. A student who is ineligible for readmission may not apply for readmission and any such application submitted will not be considered; there is no appeal for a student who is ineligible for readmission.

(3) Students who are not eligible for readmission for academic reasons may be provided with the opportunity to participate in the Academic Amnesty Program. Undergraduate students may be readmitted to UCF after five or more years of separation. This program allows the student to nullify up to two consecutive terms worth of UCF course work from his or her UCF grade point average. Details regarding participation in the Academic Amnesty Program are included in the Undergraduate Catalog.
